Communications No. 7 - March 2023

Must be read at the first meeting following receipt, before being filed for reference.

1. Sec. 301 – Eligibility (pg. 33):

Any member in good standing in her respective Auxiliary shall be eligible for election as a County Council, District, Department or National Delegate. Delegates and Alternates shall serve for one (1) full year from election to election. Delegates and Alternates shall function at the Convention and any Department Meeting where voting is called for following their election.

Delegates and Alternates elected to County Council, District, Department and National Conventions shall be recognized only when Auxiliaries have conformed to the National Bylaws.

2. Sec. 303 - District Convention and Meetings (pg. 33-34):

Delegates and Alternates to Districts shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the District Convention at which District Officers are to be elected; one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for each fifteen (15) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election of Delegates or as respective Department Bylaws may provide. The Auxiliary Secretary shall provide the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the District Secretary prior to the District Convention or as the District Standing Rules direct. Auxiliaries instituted subsequent to March 30 shall as promptly as possible elect Delegates and Alternates to the District Convention.

The term of office for which Delegates are elected shall be for one (1) year from date of the election, as described in this section, until the election of the new Delegates.

3. Sec. 304 – Department Meetings and Convention (pg. 34-35 in part):

Delegates and Alternates to Department Conventions shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the Department Convention; one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for each thirty (30) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election of Delegates, or as the Department Bylaws may provide. (our bylaws say one (1) for each fifteen (15) members or fraction thereof) The Auxiliary Secretary shall send

the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the Department Secretary prior to the close of the credentials of the Department Convention.

In Departments in which the Department Bylaws so provide, a delegate fee shall be paid by each Auxiliary for each and every Delegate to which the Auxiliary is entitled. This fee must also be paid by each member included in the composition of the Department Convention to be allowed to vote. The delegate fee shall be forwarded by each and every Auxiliary regardless of the number of Delegates present at the annual Department Convention and must be in the hands of the Department Treasurer not later than fifteen (15) calendar days before the convening of the Department Convention each year. Auxiliaries failing to forward the full delegate fee shall be considered delinquent and in arrears. However, all rights shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment. Members entitled to individual votes may pay the delegate fee at the Department Meeting.

The Department Treasurer shall set up a Department Convention fund line item in the Department budget. All Department delegate fees received by her shall be placed therein and expended only for expenses incurred in the holding of annual Department Convention.

4. Sec. 305 – National Convention (pg. 35-36):

Delegates and Alternates to the National Convention shall be elected at the last regular meeting in April; one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary on March 31. The term of office for which Delegates are elected shall be for one (1) year from date of the election, as described in this section, until the election of the new Delegates. The Auxiliary Secretary shall provide the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the National Secretary, along with their membership ID number, within thirty (30) days of the date of election.

5. Sec. 306 – Delegates - Expenses (pg. 36):

If a Delegate's expenses are to be paid, a motion to do so shall be made before election. A paid Delegate is obligated to attend every business session of Conventions and make a report of same to their Auxiliary.

6. Sec. 307 - Voting for Delegates (pg. 36):

Delegates and Alternates may be voted for on the same ticket by the passage of a motion, so ordering, before voting commences. The members receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared Delegates and those receiving the next highest number of votes shall be declared Alternates. By passage of a motion, so ordering, before voting commences, Delegates and Alternates may be elected as nominated.

- 7. If you have donations that haven't been paid please make sure they get paid! Don't forget the Dept. President's Love gift it can be sent to Judy and earmarked for this.
- **8.** There is nothing in the Bylaws that states officers have to move up through the chairs. This applies to the Auxiliary and District. Auxiliaries and Districts MAY do this but you DON'T HAVE to. **Section 801 Eligibility** on page 61 states that ANY MEMBER IN

GOOD STANDING BELONGING to an Auxiliary shall be eligible to ANY OFFICE in the Auxiliary, County Council, District, Department or the National Organization.

As you know, the Legislative Conference in Washington, DC will be held this year. There will be VFW Voice of Democracy as always on Monday, March 6, at 6 PM EST. We will have more information posted on our Facebook page as we learn more!

As we enter the month of March, I would like for everyone to remember to celebrate National Vietnam War Veterans Day on Monday, March 29th. Be sure to celebrate out men and women that served in Vietnam!

You are all doing a great job and I encourage you to keep up the great work. Make sure to get me the information for your patriotic events if you have not already done so! The following are more Patriotic Holidays that you can share with your Auxiliaries at meetings and also share with your community through social media.

April 5, 2023 – Gold Star Spouses Day – A day dedicated to those whose spouses gave their lives while serving in the U.S. military or as a result of service-connected injuries or illness.

May 1, 2023 - Loyalty Day - Loyalty Day is a day set aside for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and for recognizing the heritage of American freedom.

May 8, 2023 - V-E Day (Victory in Europe Day) — Victory in Europe Day (commonly known as V-E Day), marks the formal acceptance by the Allies of World War II of Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender of its armed forces, therefore marking the end of World War II.

May 20, 2023 - Armed Forces Day - Armed Forces Day is a day to honor Americans currently serving in the five branches of the U.S. military as well as the National Guard and Reserve units.

May 29, 2023 - Memorial Day - Memorial Day is a day to honor the men and women who died while serving in America's Armed Forces.

June 14, 2023 - Flag Day - Flag Day is June 14 and celebrates the adoption of the flag the official symbol for the United States: our Stars and Stripes. This day was first recognized by Congress on June 14, 1777, which became known as Flag Day.

July 4, 2023 - Independence Day - Independence Day, commonly known as the Fourth of July or July Fourth, commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence from Great Britain.

Some of us have been asked, "What can the National Home do for Veterans who do not live in Michigan? This is how we should be moving forward in 2023; educating our members about the National Home and how it can help Veterans in their home state. We need to put on thinking caps and come up with some creative ways to get information out to our members. Educating ourselves is the first step: you will be the teachers!

Did you know? In addition to the National Home's on-campus program, there are also off-campus services available. Off- campus services are offered to families that qualify for our on campus-services but are not interested in moving to National Home. Off- campus services include goal support, accountability and resources that are provided by a case manager. Example: A family contacted the National Home and went through the application process. They qualified; however, the family didn't want to relocate away from their support system. Therefore, it was determined that off- campus services were needed. Off-campus services were offered, including financial education, parenting classes and employment application support. These services were provided via zoom, phone conferences, and email. Typically, families can receive these services up to a year. Families that move out of the program are eligible to receive additional support from their case manager for up to a year.

5 Essentials of an Auxiliary

Don't forget that the National Organization requires only five (5) things of an Auxiliary:

- 1. Auxiliaries should have at least ten (10) business meetings per year. (Sec. 210) Five (5) members in good standing (of that Auxiliary) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. (Sec. 212)
- 2. Dues should be paid by at least ten (10) members on or before February 1 of the current year. (Sec. 207)
- 3. Quarterly Audits by Trustees must be submitted. (Sec. 814)
- 4. Officers elected, installed and reported to National Headquarters no later than June 30. This generates the bond application via email. (Sec. 804A and 806A)
- 5. The offices of President and Treasurer MUST be bonded by August 31.

The 2023 VFW Legislative Conference is being held March 5 - 9. This is an opportunity for VFW Leaders from across the United States to meet with their respective lawmakers and personally lobby for what is important for their state and watch the VFW Commander-In-Chief testify before the House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committee on behalf of Veterans.

If you know a Veteran that may have been exposed to burn pits or any other toxic substances while serving and needs medical assistance, have them go to VFW.org. The VFW does not charge for Pact Act benefit support. No need to pay for help in getting benefits.

If you know a Veteran that is in immediate suicide crisis or has mental health issues, have them call **988** or <u>National Suicide Prevention Hotline</u>, call 1-800-273-8255. They can also go to any VA hospital. Veterans are about 1.5 times more likely to attempt suicide than civilians.

When a bill is going through Congress, and it is of interest to you or our Veteran's it is best to include as many groups and organizations as you can. Such as political and civic organizations geared toward young adults. These organizations can be found at colleges and universities in your local area.

Keep your remarks nonpartisan remember we support bills not people or political parties.

Be as creative as you can in your letters, poems, sketches, drawings, and other communications. The idea is to get their attention for the cause. Have your communication stand out against all the hundreds they receive.

Be an Advocate – Be Informed – Be Engaged

One of the main objectives of the Legislative Program is to improve the lives of our veterans, service members and their families through advocacy.
