ELECTION DAY!

Reminder: Election Day is Tuesday November 8, 2022. Be sure you vote and remind/encourage everyone you know to vote. All House of Representatives members are up for re-election as well as many Senate members. The VFW and the VFW Auxiliary would like as many Veteran friendly members be elected into Congress as possible.

The VFW Action Corp Weekly urges all members to act and contact your congressperson about supporting H.R. 8736 Governing Unaccredited Representatives Defrauding VA Benefits Act or Guard VA Benefits Act. This Act is to reinstate penalties for charging Veterans and survivors unauthorized fees to assist with claims for VA benefits.

When a bill is going through Congress, and it is of interest to you or our Veteran's it is best to include as many groups and organizations as you can. Such as political and civic organizations geared toward young adults. These organizations can be found at colleges and universities in your local area.

Keep your remarks nonpartisan - remember we support bills not people or political parties.

Be as creative as you can in your letters, poems, sketches, drawings, and other communications. The idea is to get their attention for the cause. Have your communication stand out against all the hundreds they receive.

Be an Advocate – Be Informed – Be Engaged

One of the main objectives of the Legislative Program is to improve the lives of our veterans, service members and their families through advocacy.

Hello Brothers and Sisters! This year is flying by, but just like every year, our passion for serving our Veterans is unwavering! This month we're going to talk about Veteran's Suicide.

This is a tough topic in every scenario, and it's a very taboo topic that we all try to avoid. Unfortunately, however, it happens each and every day. Veterans are at a 57% higher risk of committing suicide than those who haven't served. Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death in veterans UNDER the age of 45. All of our Veterans are at risk, and that's why it's so crucial that we are present and aware of the signs.

Our homeless Veterans are also the most likely ones to consider suicide. It's never something we want to deal with, but it is so important that we are equipped should the need arise. The Veterans Crisis Line connects Veterans in crisis and their families and friends with qualified, caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders through a confidential toll-free hotline, online chat, or text. Veterans and their loved ones can dial 988 and Press 1, chat online, or send a text message to 838255 to receive confidential support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Support for deaf and hard of hearing individuals is available.
